HALL OF FAME

Criteria for Inductees

The T.A.S.H.A. Hall of Fame honors a person for his or her contributions to the Texas Saddlebred industry and dedication to the improvement of the breed through long time support of the Texas American Saddle Horse Association.

Nominations and Selection

All nominators must be active members of T.A.S.H.A.

Nominator must submit in writing a brief biography of the nominee and nominating member's opinion as to why this person should be inducted into the T.A.S.H.A. Hall of Fame (*E-mail submission to the T.A.S.H.A. Board of Directors is acceptable*). More than one nominee may be submitted by the same nominating member.

Living nominees should have no less than 10 current consecutive years of membership with T.A.S.H.A.

Barring special circumstances (i.e.: husband and wife, team, or other circumstances to be reviewed by the board), only one deceased and/or one living person should be inducted per year.

The deadline for receipt of nominations is October 31.

The nominees will be reviewed by the full board and inductees will be selected by vote of the full board.

Induction of nominee honorees will occur at the T.A.S.H.A. Awards Banquet or at a special presentation at the first T.A.S.H.A. horse show of the fiscal year in a non T.A.S.H.A. Awards Banquet year.
